Facilities

Located in the heart of Honolulu, a 25-acre campus houses both the Upper and Lower Schools. The campus features:

- Two libraries - one in the Upper School, one in the Lower School
- A two-story art building which includes a Lower School art room, an art gallery, darkroom, ceramics lab and foundry
- A music facility with 3 large rehearsal rooms and 8 practice rooms
- 6 computer labs, video conferencing facilities and computers in every classroom
- 2 dance rooms - one in the Upper School, one in the Lower School
- 2 gyms and Lower School covered playcourts
- An Olympic-size pool, 6 tennis courts and a weight room
- Track and football stadium, baseball and soccer fields
- State of the art science labs
- St. Alban's Chapel

Curriculum

The 'Iolani curriculum enables each student to develop to his or her full potential. Personal attention and positive reinforcement foster healthy self-concepts and a sound educational foundation. Sixteen credits are required for graduation, including four years of English, three years of math, three years of a foreign language, two years of science, three years of history and quarter/semester requirements in art, music, physical education, religion, computer and guidance.

Performing and Visual Arts

The Performing Arts Department presents a Fall play, a Spring musical and travel opportunities to the mainland and foreign countries. 84% of the Upper School students are enrolled in PAD courses. Art students participate in the Scholastic Art Competition.

- Chorus, Hula, Jazz, Orchestra, Band, Musical Theater and Orff Ensemble for gr. 4-6
- Electives in Chorus, Band I, II, III and IV, Stage Band I, II, and III, Orchestra I, II, III, IV, and V, Dance I, II, III, and IV, Beginning, Intermediate, and Advanced Theater, and Music Theory.
- Drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture, and mixed media in Lower School
- Ceramics, 3-D Design, Drawing, Mixed Media, Painting, Beginning and Advanced Photography, AP Studio Art and Building Technologies in the Upper School

Athletics

Over 70% of the Upper School students play at least one sport. As a member of the Interscholastic League of Honolulu, 'Iolani offers:

- 90 boys' and girls' teams from intermediate to varsity levels
- Varsity level competition in soccer, wrestling, water polo, paddling, kayaking, baseball, football, tennis, bowling, cross country, softball, golf, cheerleading, track and field, volleyball, basketball, swimming, diving and sailing
- 2008 ILH Champions in Boys' Basketball, D-II Football, and Boys' Soccer; State Champions in Football and Boys' Volleyball

College Placement

99% of the 230 graduates in the Class of 2008 enrolled in 94 different 4-year colleges.

- 88% enrolled in mainland colleges and universities
- 32 were National Merit Semifinalists, representing 47% of Hawaii's total
- 89% participated in the AP program; 42% took 3 or more AP classes in their senior year.

Admission Guidelines

'Iolani accepts approximately 250 new students each year from diverse economic, cultural and religious backgrounds. Kindergarten candidates must submit their applications by October 30. The deadline for grades 6 - 12 is December 1.

- Application fee is \$100
- Boys applying to kindergarten must turn 5 by June 30, 2009.
- Girls applying to kindergarten must turn 5 by September 30, 2009.
